

56th Fighter Wing To Fly And Fight The 16



Overview

The 56th Fighter Wing is a United States Air Force unit stationed at Luke Air Force Base in Arizona. It is one of the most storied units in the USAF, and has flown and fought in every major conflict since World War II. The 56th Fighter Wing is currently flying the F-16 Fighting Falcon, and is preparing to transition to the F-35 Lightning II.





History

The 56th Fighter Wing was activated on January 15, 1941, at Selfridge Field in Michigan. It was originally equipped with P-40 Warhawks, and deployed to North Africa in 1942. The 56th Fighter Wing flew combat missions in support of the Allied invasion of Sicily and the Italian campaign. In 1944, the wing was transferred to the Pacific Theater, where it flew combat missions in support of the Allied invasion of the Philippines. 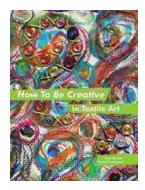
