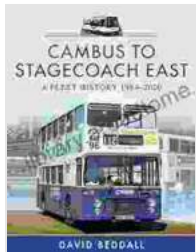

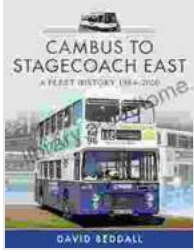
In 2014, the East Fleet adopted a new livery that was based on the livery of the Scottish Citylink network. This livery featured a red and white colour scheme with a blue stripe.

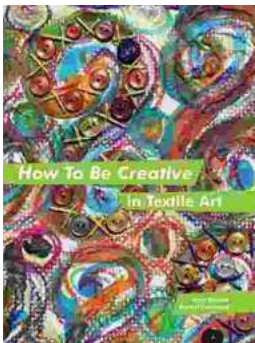

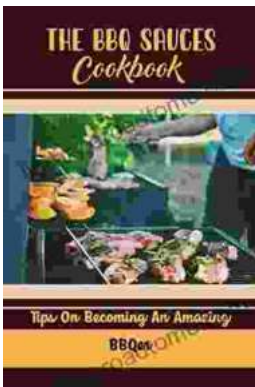
